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Your first blog post for the semester is due Friday, February 3. We will continue to blog every other week in this course till the end of the semester. Below is some additional information to guide you through this process.

## **Blogs will be graded based on the following rubric:**

- Content: Present your thoughts, not an overview, of the topic in a clearly, logical manner.
- Word Count: EACH blog post you write should be *a minimum of 200 words*.
- Citation: Provide a link to a minimum of **two** credible sources to support your point (Note: Sites such as wikipedia, about, dictionary, ask, and those similar to them will not be counted towards your credible sources.)
- Grammar: Review your entry prior to posting. Although you may not catch everything, you should strive to use correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation at all times.

## **Additional information:**

- You will need to check my blog ([www.practicalissues.wordpress.com](http://www.practicalissues.wordpress.com)) each week for the Topic(s) of the Week (T.O.W.) and to see if you need to comment on a post I have written. (**Note:** I will provide you with two topics; you will only need to select one to write a blog entry on.)
- You will comment on **a minimum of three** of my blog posts, for credit, during the course of this semester (i.e. January 17, 2012-May 4, 2012).
- You will comment on **a minimum of six** of your classmate's blog posts, for credit, during the course of this semester (i.e. January 17, 2012-May 4, 2012).
- When commenting on a classmate's blog, it is your responsibility to remain civil and be constructive in your comments. In addition to commenting on their blog (the classmate's WordPress blog), you must create a blog entry on your blog with the names of those whose blogs you commented on and the comments you made (see example below). Also, please select the category you created for this class (i.e. PRCA 2330). (**Note:** Blog entries denoting comments are in addition to the T.O.W.)
